How Resolution Together works in practice

## Individual meetings

Individual meeting to discuss suitability and next steps. Following which both decide whether they want to sign up to Resolution Together

## Joint meeting

An initial meeting with both parties to discuss the various ways of resolving issues arising from separation and to set the agenda

## Arrangements for children

Joint meeting to discuss the arrangements for children and what further financial information is needed

## Parenting plan

Preparation of a parenting plan if appropriate and consideration as to whether the family would benefit from the support of a counsellor, and assistance from experts, e.g. with regard to valuations/pensions

## Exchange of financial information

## Valuation

Including any valuation evidence from valuers/accountants and pension advice

## Settlement options

Following a settlement meeting, an Early Neutral Evaluation can be arranged, if it is felt that a barristers input would assist.

## Independent legal advice

Opportunity for both to take legal advice. However, this can be taken at any stage if needed



9



## Financial proposals

Final session at which it is hoped a final set of financial proposals will be prepared



10



## Signed by all

Solicitor drafts the documentation which is signed by all before the court is asked to approve

## Costs
